



Emilio Bizzi, M.D., Ph.D.

Born in Rome, Italy, Emilio Bizzi received his M.D. from the University of Rome, and his Docenza from the University of Pisa. Currently an Institute Professor Emeritus at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, he also serves as an Investigator at MIT's McGovern Institute for Brain Research and previously served as Chairman of the Department of Brain and Cognitive

Sciences at MIT and Director of Whitaker College of Health Sciences, Technology, and Management at MIT.

He is a member of the National Academy of Sciences, National Academy of Medicine, and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, where he served as President for three years. He has been elected to the Accademia dei Lincei, Rome, and awarded a degree "honoris causa" in Biomedical Engineering, University of Genova, Italy.

He has won awards for his research and academic work including the W. Alden Spencer Award and the Hermann von Helmholtz Award for Excellence in Neuroscience, and is the recipient of the President of Italy Gold Medal for achievements in science and the Empedocles Prize.

He has authored numerous publications over the years, including text books, journal articles, reviews, and abstracts.
